03 Core Concepts

No-code agentic automation

Tools like n8n and Zapier let you wire triggers (new email, form, webhook) to AI steps (classify, summarise, draft) to actions (create ticket, send message, update CRM). You ship useful automation fast without managing infrastructure.

Workflow anatomy

A workflow is trigger -> transform/AI -> action, with branching on conditions. AI nodes add judgement — routing, extraction, drafting — that rigid rule-based automation can't. n8n adds full agent nodes that call tools in a loop.

Reliability & humans

Add error branches, retries, and human-approval steps for consequential actions (sending external email, spending money). Idempotency and logging prevent duplicate or runaway executions.

When to graduate to code

No-code is ideal for prototypes and many production flows. Move to code when you need complex logic, heavy scale, custom models, or tight testing — often a hybrid where n8n orchestrates and calls your APIs.

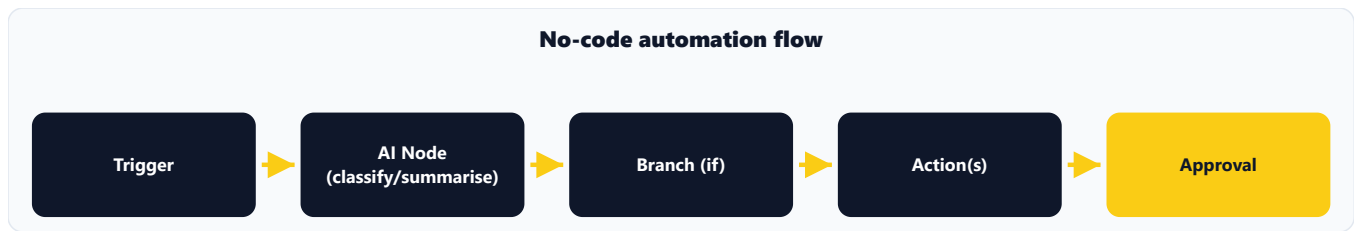


Figure 22 — Trigger → AI judgement → branch → action, with a human approval gate for consequential steps.

✂ Multi-app n8n AI Workflow Automation

1. Set a trigger (incoming email or form submission).
2. Add an AI node to classify and summarise the input.
3. Branch to actions: create a task, draft a reply, notify a channel.
4. Add an approval step and an error-handling branch.

Conceptual n8n node chain (trigger -> AI -> action)

08 Lab Assistant

Lab 22 · n8n AI workflow

Prerequisites: An n8n instance (cloud or local) · An LLM credential

1. Add an email/form trigger

Expected: The workflow fires on new input

2. Add an AI node to classify + summarise

Expected: Structured judgement passed downstream

3. Branch to actions + an approval step + error branch

Expected: Safe, reliable automation

Troubleshooting

- Duplicate actions → make steps idempotent.
- Silent failures → add an error branch and logging.

09 Pitfalls & Key Takeaways

⚠ COMMON PITFALLS

- No approval gate before external/consequential actions.
- Missing error branches, so one failure stalls the pipeline.
- Non-idempotent steps causing duplicate actions on retry.

✓ KEY TAKEAWAYS

- No-code tools ship agentic automation fast across many apps.
- AI nodes add judgement that rule-based flows lack.
- Approvals, retries, and idempotency make automations safe.
